



PROBLEMATIC CLEANING CHEMICALS

"Quats" (Ammonium quaternary compounds)

Bleach

SAFER DISINFECTING

Look for disinfectants with active ingredients such as:

- alcohol/ethanol/isopropanol
- hydrogen peroxide
- lactic acid
- citric acid
- thymol






WHAT ARE PFAS?

What are the health effects of PFAS exposure?

- Cancer (Kidney, Liver, Testicular)
- High cholesterol
- Reproductive toxicity
- Developmental toxicity
- Decreased immune response
- Preeclampsia

8 states have established rules about PFAS in water

Massachusetts:

- New groundwater standard
- Proposed drinking water standard
- One of the strongest in the country

WHAT CAN YOU DO?



Ask your water supplier about PFAS & your drinking water

Avoid Teflon coated cookware - and don't overheat if you do use it

Avoid takeout food packaging and/or take food out of packaging quickly

Bring your own reusable containers to take home leftovers



- Reproductive damage





Vacuum and mop often to reduce dust


Wash hands before eating



Before buying new furniture, check the tag to see if it's flame retardant free

When buying foam products (nursing pillows, car seats etc.) ask if the products contain flame retardants

Avoid memory foam mattresses & those shipped rolled up in a box
